Faith makes great burdens light.
Unbelief makes light ones intolerably heavy.

Faith helps us when we're down.
Unbelief throws us down when we're up.

Faith brings us near to God when we're far from Him.
Unbelief puts us far from God when we're near to Him.

Faith puts a man under GRACE.
Unbelief holds a man under wrath.

Faith purifies the mind.
Unbelief keeps it polluted and unpure.

Faith makes us more acceptable to God through the Messiah.
But whatsoever is unbelief is sin. ("Without faith it is impossible to please Him").

Faith gives us comfort and peace in our souls.
Unbelief works troubles and tossings like the restless waves of the sea.

Faith makes us see the preciousness of our Saviour.
Unbelief sees no form and no beauty or comeliness in Him.

By faith we live our lives in the fulfillment and fulness of the Messiah.
By unbelief we starve and fade away.

Faith gives us the victory over the Law and sin and death and the devil and the fallen angels.
Unbelief lays us obnoxiously before them.

Faith will show us more excellency in things not seen than in things that are.

Unbelief sees more of things that are than of things that will be hereafter.

Faith makes the ways of God pleasant and admirable.

Unbelief makes them heavy and hard.

“By faith Abraham, by faith Issac, by faith Jacob possessed the land of the promise.”
