1:19 departed from Horeb (cf. 1:6-8)

Israel is now a NATION besides being a PEOPLE (another promise of the Abrahamic Covenant); Sinai (Mosaic) Covenant.

Theologically important point:

- (1) the covenant is with a NATION and concerns everything associated with a nation
- (2) the Church is NOT a nation; it is a transnational entity
- (3) therefore it does NOT and cannot replace a "nation"
- (4) the NT imperatives do NOT cover comprehensive functions of a nation

great and scary wilderness

Kadesh barnea....

Oasis with springs and on the southern boundary of the land.

1:20 which Yahweh our God is giving [Heb: [participle=action going on] to us

1:21 has given the land before you. . . as the Yahweh God of our fathers spoke don't fear and don't be dismayed. . .

Choice here: God's promise vs. a test.

Faith Rest Drill:

- (1) clear revealed promise, not a mystical feeling or a "hunch";
- (2) history of confirmed faithfulness over the super-power nation (Egypt) >> any of the Canaanite "nations"
- (3) entry into their inheritance = economic, political, and social prosperity

1:22-25

Intelligence recon for (1) best attack route; and (2) enemy defences.

1:26 not willing. . . rebelled against the mouth of Yahweh your God

Choice right here revealed for what it is:

- (1) mouth → source of the command:
- (2) 2^{nd} person plural \rightarrow their covenant position as members of the nation

1:27 murmuring, complaining

Murmuring is opposite of thanksgiving!! /////// SLIDE #5 /////

in Yahweh's hatred of us he brought us out of Egypt. . .

PRINCIPLE: The mental attitude of "thanksgiving" is a barometer of our spiritual state! **1 Thess 5:18** "in everything **give thanks** for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you"

Phil 4:6-7: "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, **with thanksgiving**, let your requests be made known to God. . . ."

1:30 Yahweh your God is walking before you to fight for you as he did for you in Egypt

Plagues and destruction of the Exodus event **>** control of the entire natural environment as the true Creator.

- 1:31 carried you as a man carries his son
- 1:32 you were not believing in Yahweh your God
- 1:33 who was going before you to ...to...

PRINCIPLE: God "pushes us" to spiritually advance toward maturity by successive trials.

- 1. Gives us as at salvation a sufficient revelation of His character (if the gospel is clear!);
- 2. Sovereign power to reach us through specific circumstances in our personal life;
- 3. <u>Loving resolution of our sin problem</u> through the grace of the Cross, saving us from Hell.
- 4. Therefore we have a rationale that argues "from the greater to the lesser" **Rom 8:32** "He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him freely give us all things?"

B. CONSEQUENCES (see Slide #1)

1:34 Yahweh...became angry...

Reaction within His condescension to the human level that expresses His integrity.

1:35 "If anyone among these men—this evil generation—sees the good land which I swore to your fathers... [I'm not the living God]"

1:36 because he "filled up" [the tests of following] after Yahweh

NOT sinless perfection, but passing the critical tests that God sends our way.

1 Kings 11:4-8 = example of David vs. Solomon

1:37-38 even you shall not. . . Joshua

1:39 and your children...

Continues the sentence of **1:36** defining who will survive and enter the land.

no knowledge of good and evil. . .

Choice & consequences pertain to those who are <u>responsible</u>—who can make an informed choice.

Num 14:29 \rightarrow males under 20 years of age \rightarrow wives, daughters, and sons under 20 years old would survive and form the 2^{nd} generation.

1:40 and you—turn yourselves around and set out...

Num 14:33-34 → 40 years for the 40 days of the spy operation that failed

1:41 then you answered...

Human attempt to alter the consequences of a bad choice = failure!! Failed the <u>discipline</u> test.

Discipline test = trusting the Lord to help you live with the consequences.

we sinned. . .

phony confession; religious pretense that God isn't buying!

1:42 I am not in your midst

1:43-45 Yahweh did not hear your voice and did not listen to you...

Phony religion doesn't cut it!!


III. CONCLUSION


Deut 1:19-46 narrates for us the failure of an entire generation—failure to pass an a <u>spiritual conflict</u> test after passing some of the previous <u>logistical</u> tests.


It shows the <u>law of responsibility</u>: God gives us choices and He—not us—determines the consequences.

After bad choices, we have <u>discipline tests</u>: are we going to look to Him to help us live with the consequences or are we going to try human gimmicks to "relieve" them?
